

Mission Groups FAQs

Will my group all work together? Groups assignments are based on the mission preference forms turned in by each youth. We will make every effort to make sure each team has 2 or 3 students from each church.

Does my group need to supply materials? All mission site materials are included in the Deep Impact costs. Students participating in construction will need to bring a hammer, nail bag, eye protection, and a measuring tape.

Who provides transportation to the mission sites? Each group is responsible to provide transportation for the number of people registered. Older 15 passenger vans will only be allowed to carry 11 due to safety concerns.

When will my group know their mission group assignments? As a general rule you group should know their assignments within 10 days of your mission week. Please remember mission work is flexible and groups may change.

Will my group receive training? YES! You will receive a general training DVD to show to your group prior to your arrival. In addition, Monday afternoon is designated as training time for each group.

Do I need to bring skilled construction leaders? While it is always welcomed the answer is no. However, please have any skilled adult chaperone indicate his or her skill level on the mission preference form.

What is the dress code for the mission sites? Students should wear T-shirts or work shirts on the mission site. No cutoffs, ripped sleeves, shirts with offensive language, or tight knitted tank tops will be allowed. Shorts must be at least mid-thigh in length (most Soffe style shorts are too short). Closed toe shoes are required for construction sites.
