What is Deep Impact?

To have a successful Deep Impact experience it is important to understand the history, identity and core values of Deep Impact.

History

Deep Impact was born out of a vision to involve middle and high school students in both missions education and missions involvement through a camp experience. Deep Impact began more than a decade ago as a mission boot camp at the NC Baptist Assembly at Fort Caswell, under the leadership of NC Baptist Men. This week of missions learning and hands-on missions remained a summer mainstay at Fort Caswell and expanded to include a yearly international week in Tegucigalpa, Honduras, a one-time week in New York City and several inner city weekends.

In 2007, NC Baptist Men decided to build on the success of Deep Impact and expand the opportunity for churches by making Deep Impact a summer long student mission camp. Over the past four years Deep Impact has seen tremendous growth, from involving 350 students in two weeks of camp to last summer involving more than 1,200 students in 10 camps across North Carolina and the world. This summer Deep Impact will involve more than 1,500 students in 14 camps throughout North Carolina, New York City, and Honduras. God is continuing to use Deep Impact as a way to involve students and their leaders in the Great Commission.

Statement of Identity

Deep Impact is a pre-packaged mission experience for middle and high school students and their adult leaders.

Mission Statement

Deep Impact is designed to give middle and high school students and their adult leaders the opportunity to share the love of Christ with others in both word and deed through multiple projects.

Purpose Statement

Deep Impact has as its purpose three key elements. 1. To assist the host church or association with the ongoing Kingdom vision for the community in which the host is located. 2. To give middle and high school students opportunity to be involved in mission work according to their passion and gifts. 3. To provide an opportunity to worship together through music and teaching in order to provide a foundational structure for the purpose of mission action.

Core Values

While Deep Impact site locations are different, the core values of each Deep Impact week remain the same.

Core Value #1: The ultimate task for a Deep Impact team on a mission site is to enter in a person's journey of faith. This entrance can be manifested through an act of kindness in the name of Christ, introduction of the Gospel, acceptance of Christ as Savior or a step of discipleship.

Core Value #2: NC Baptist Men consider all Christ followers as missionaries and uses Deep Impact as a tool for equipping students to be mission leaders in their churches and communities through hands-on mission experiences.

Core Value #3: Deep Impact Youth Mission Weeks will be managed with the highest level of stewardship possible in order to control costs. It is at the core of Deep Impact to provide an affordable mission experience to all students who wish to participate.

Core Value #4: Mission education and mobilization are interconnected and must be woven together in a creative and effective way. Deep Impact is designed to teach the Biblical mandate for missions through creative worship, hands-on mission opportunities and prayer.

Core Value #5: Deep Impact Mission Weeks are planned, designed and operated to reach the target audience of middle and high school students through a mission and camp experience. All Deep Impact events, guidelines and regulations will be target group focused.

Parent Meeting Guide

The following information is a guide to help you provide parents of your students all the information they need to send their students to Deep Impact. This is simply a guide and can be modified to fit your particular situation.

Introduction and Prayer 5 minutes

What is Deep Impact? Spend a few minutes explaining what Deep Impact is to your parents so they will know how to pray for and how to prepare their student to go.

Forms (medical, covenant, T-shirt and mission preference) 15 minutes

It is good to have parents complete these forms while you have them together at this meeting.

What to Bring 10 minutes

It is a good idea to make a copy of the “What to Bring” page for every parent. There are no laundry facilities. PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU COVER THE DRESS CODE WITH EVERY PARENT AND STUDENT!

Sample Daily Schedule 5 minutes

Go over the sample schedule so that students know what to expect and parents know how to pray for their students.

Mission Team Experience 5 minutes

Take time to explain that your students will be placed on mission teams according to their mission preference. They will work with youth from other churches. Your adult leaders will also be placed on a mission team for the week.

Church's Expectations 10 minutes

While Deep Impact is a pre-packaged mission week, it is important for you to set goals and expectations for the week. This is the time to discuss the timeline for money due, your expectations of students on mission, and other elements important to success.

Questions and Answers 5-10 minutes

Take the last few minutes to answer any questions still left unresolved.

- I will touch others appropriately, being sensitive that there may be those who have abusive backgrounds.

I do not have any of the following that would exclude me from working with minors:

- An illness or disease that may affect my work with children or youth.
- A conviction of a criminal offense.
- Been held liable to a court for a civil wrongdoing or an order made against me by a matrimonial or family court.
- Been dismissed, disciplined, moved to other work or resigned from any paid or voluntary work as a result of complaints, charges or allegations that my conduct resulted in any kind of harm to children or youth.

Background Check Policy/Forms for Deep Impact 2012

Please read the background policy information below, issued by John M. Butler, Executive Leader of Business Services for the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina. The forms mentioned are also included.

TO: Churches Sending Youth to Deep Impact during Summer 2012

FROM: North Carolina Baptist Men (NCBM) and Baptist State Convention of North Carolina (BSCNC)

Background checks on all adults who will be chaperoning, teaching Bible studies or accompanying youth from your church to Deep Impact are a necessary part of protecting the youth of your church. North Carolina Baptist Men and the Baptist State Convention feels that you, as a church, need to know that you are doing everything you can to protect your youth and the assets of your church. It is our hope that you have already put in place a policy that requires background checks for anyone working with children from cradle roll up to those who have reached age 18.

North Carolina Baptist Men must have a form from your church on adults (this includes youth on the trip who have already turned 18 before the Deep Impact Week) accompanying the youth who are attending Deep Impact summer missions camp. We have formatted a sheet on which you can list people who have had background checks and are cleared to work or chaperone. It will be the responsibility of your church to get the background checks completed on all adults going with your group at least one week prior to departure. Any adult from your church working or chaperoning youth who comes to Deep Impact and whose names are missing from this sheet will not be allowed to stay on the grounds at Deep Impact. This must be done for the protection of all youth, your church, NCBM and BSCNC.

Your church can choose any background company that you like. NCBM and BSCNC realizes that if you have not done background checks in the past, you may need to get in touch with a reputable company. Here at NCBM and BSCNC, we have used First Point Resources, out of Greensboro, NC.

Scott Hall, the manager of First Point Resources, is a Baptist and he, himself, attended Caswell as a youth. Scott has told BSCNC that he will give churches a special rate of **\$10 per person** for a criminal background check and a sexual misconduct check. That is a real bargain!! For those who routinely drive youth to events, you may want to include a driving record also – that would be an additional expense. If you want to use First Point, you have to call Scott Hall directly at 800-288-7408 Ext 3037 or you can send him an email at shall@firstpointresources.com to set up an account for your church. Please identify yourself as a church that got the letter from NCBM and BSCNC regarding adults helping with Deep Impact summer mission camps.

For your convenience, attached is a First Point form (use this form only for First Point Resources) which every candidate would have to complete VERY LEGIBLY. If it is not highly readable when faxed to First Point, your staff will be called to clarify information or you will have to ask the adult to resubmit the form to you. You will need to maintain a file with copies of all forms and a copy of the report on each person cleared in the background check. This will be valuable information in a court of law should your church ever be sued for the actions of any adult working with youth.

Thank you for your cooperation. Again, I remind you that you can choose any company you wish to do the background checks; but the names of all adults accompanying your youth group must appear on the form to be presented at Registration when your group arrives for Deep Impact.

Form for church to keep in its files with First Point or other company form:

I realize that to safeguard the youth and the church a background check must be performed by a professional company and a file kept at the church for future reference. I realize that if I fail to disclose any that might be found, I will not be allowed to work with youth at my church. (Note: Things that one has been told are expunged from public records usually have not been!)

IMPORTANT!!! Please READ to all your students and parents!

Alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs and weapons of any kind are not permitted on the Deep Impact campuses or mission sites. Pocketknives are considered weapons and can only be carried at the construction sites if needed. Electronic devices are discouraged for the week and are not allowed to be used during worship or while working on the mission sites. Cell phone use on the mission sites is not allowed by any youth and is only allowed by adults for emergency use. Any electronic device or other valuable is brought at the risk of the person bringing the property. North Carolina Baptist Men will not be responsible for the damage, loss or theft of any personal property brought to Deep Impact.

Important Safety Information Concerning 15-Passenger Vans

It has come to our attention that there is an increased risk of accidents for using 15-passenger vans when people of any weight are seated in the rear seat (or in the area of the rear seat, for those vans which have had the rear seat removed). Weight in this extended area of the van has been found to make the vehicle unstable in the event of an emergency, such as when the driver turns sharply to avoid an accident. Due to the increased risk of accidents related to this type of weight distribution in 15-passenger vans, Deep Impact and North Carolina Baptist Men will no longer send mission teams out with participants assigned to ride in the back seat of a 15-passenger van.

Furthermore, the space in the back seat area of the van is not to be used by our teams to transport equipment, supplies, or anything else that would add weight to this area of the van. Therefore, the maximum number of people we will assign to any 15-passenger van will be 11 participants. In addition, all drivers will be required to make sure that all participants who are traveling in their vehicles wear seat belts.

If you are using a 15-passenger van (or vans) to transport your group to Deep Impact this year please make sure that you provide enough transportation space for the total number in the group that you bring, counting only 11 passengers per van. This will ensure that we have enough drivers and transportation space for all participants to travel to and from their Deep Impact mission sites.

We realize that this may require your group to bring more vehicles than you initially planned. We apologize for this inconvenience, but we cannot yield to convenience by placing your students and chaperones at risk.

Deep Impact Dress Code

Please make sure you read the following to each student, his or her parent(s), and all adult leaders participating in Deep Impact Youth Mission Weeks:

Deep Impact Youth Mission Weeks are designed to advance the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the lives of those who attend and those who are reached through the mission projects. To ensure we do our best to make Deep Impact a great experience for everyone we require that the guidelines outlined below be followed as appropriate dress for the week:

Do not wear T-shirts or other clothing with offensive language, advertisements or pictures.

Short shorts will not be permitted any time during the Deep Impact week. See picture below of what is permitted and what is not. Shorts/skirt length will be on or close (within 2 inches) to the top of the knee. This measurement includes skirts. All pants, shorts and skirts should also be worn up on the waist.

Do not wear cutoffs, or any type of sleeveless shirt (this includes factory made sleeveless shirts). Low cut shirts are also prohibited.

If there is an opportunity at your Deep Impact location to swim and the venue is arranged by NC Baptist Men, bikinis are not allowed. Please bring only one-piece swim suits or modest two-piece suits. Modest is a tankini type swimsuit where the top and bottom pieces are touching. Male suits are to be the board short type of swimwear worn up on the hips, not below the hips.

No bare feet in the dining area.

Students on construction and sports sites must wear covered shoes. While sandals are ok to wear at most sites, athletic shoes are the best and safest shoes at all sites.

Please remember to monitor your group so others will not feel led to complain to the Deep Impact staff.

A dress code issue will be handled in the following manner:

The Deep Impact Director, Assistant Directors and/or Coordinator will take the issue to the group leader.

The group leader will then handle the situation with their student.

Repeated violations of the dress code or failure to comply after action is taken may result in a dismissal from the Deep Impact campus.

The Deep Impact staff relies heavily on youth group leaders to help make a mission week successful. Please do your part to make sure the above guidelines are followed without exception.

Mission Team Structure

Mission Projects

Local churches, associations and NC Baptist Men generate mission projects. Students and their leaders from participating churches across North Carolina complete the mission projects. To do this successfully we combine the efforts of paid summer staff, dedicated volunteers and youth leaders who bring their youth to Deep Impact. The following will help you understand the flow of how mission projects are successfully completed and how you can help make this the best experience possible for your group.

Training

It is important to understand the training that will take place prior to your group going out on the mission sites during Deep Impact. To make this training possible and effective we need youth leaders to agree to fill two important positions on each team. The Team Leader and Team Motivator positions are described below. Please indicate on the Team Roster form who from your group is willing to fill these positions. Remember, all adult leaders will serve on a team.

Team Leader

The Team Leader from each mission team will be the key person on each team to make sure the mission project is completed. The Team Leader will be the key contact person to and from the Deep Impact staff. The Team Leader will be the key contact person on the mission site and will supervise the site and the students and other leaders on the site.

Team Motivator

The Team Motivator for each mission team will be the care person for the students. The Team Motivator will keep up with the medical forms, make sure the team has its lunches, build and keep morale, and care for the general well-being of the team. They will encourage students to stay involved with their mission team.
